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## MAKING YOU DIY LOOM

playhouse

[a piece of firm cardboard (3ply or more); 2 metres of twine or rope; a 6" inch twig or stick, 1/2 metre long bits of yarn (6 to 7 colours) and scissors]







## **CREATING THE LOOM**

- 1. Cut the cardboard to size 5" by 9" (inches)
- 2. Draw a line half an inch from the bottom and top edges
- 3. Mark a point on the line drawn above at every 1/2 inch mark and the top and the bottom edges. You will get 10 points on either side
- 4. Draw 10 lines from the points to the edges and cut them
- 5. Now draw a line on either side 1 inch inwards from where you cut and fold to make a crease

- 6. Cut 10 strings each being 24 inches long
- 7. Attach all the 10 strings by folding them double and then looping them over the twig as shown in the picture
- 8. Next pass those 10 strings through the slits you have made in the bottom edge
- 9. Tie knots at the bottom as shown in the picture. This will avoid the wapr from slipping when the children are weaving

## WEAVING AND FINISHING

- 1. We can begin weaving now with the colours yarn
- 2. Once you finish weaving, use a sewing needle and weave in all the ends and trim
- 3. Time to take it off the loom start with the bottom and pull off. Next you can pull off the part attached to the twig
- 4. Last step is to secure the bottom by tying 2 knotted strings into a single knot. 10 strings become 5.



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
